

The *Passports Act* 1920 provides that any person entering the Commonwealth of Australia who is required to be in possession of a passport shall, if required, give up his passport to a Customs Officer before leaving the vessel by which he arrives in Australia.
2. When the passport is collected a receipt will be given for it, and the passport will be retained by the Customs authorities until the owner is about to leave the Commonwealth.
3. Any person wishing to obtain possession of his passport for further travel should apply, at least FOURTEEN DAYS prior to the date of intended departure, to the Collector of Customs of the State in which the person is residing, and should produce the receipt for passport. Persons resident in Victoria should apply to the Secretary, Home and Territories Department, 61 Spring Street, Melbourne.
4. The passport will require to be visaed for the journey out of Australia. The fee for a Commonwealth visa is 2/-. A copy of photograph will be required in connexion with the application for a visa.
5. In the event of the loss of this receipt, a passport will only be returned to the owner upon the production of a statutory declaration to that effect, and on the owner being identifiable as the person represented in the passport.

1. The *Passports Act 1920* provides that any person entering the Commonwealth of Australia who is required to be in possession of a passport shall, if required, give up his passport to a Customs Officer before leaving the vessel by which he arrives in Australia.
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5. In the event of the loss of this receipt, a passport will only be returned to the owner upon the production of a statutory declaration to that effect, and on the owner being identifiable as the person represented in the passport.
