Professor of Music

Respectfully Sheweth

That your Memorialist is a Native of Berlin
in the Kingdom of Prussia

That your Memorialist is forty five years
of age and is by Profession a Professor of Music

That your Memorialist arrived in the Colony
of Victoria a Passenger by the Steamer "Ant" from
Launceston in the Island of Tasmania in the
month of July One thousand eight hundred and
fifty six since which date he has been resident
in the said Colony.

That your Memorialist begs to refer Your
Excellency to the annexed Certificate of character
and of the correctness of the statements herein
contained from respectable persons to whom your
Memorialist has been known since his arrival in
the said Colony.

That your Memorialist is desirous of
holding land by purchase and of establishing himself
in the Colony of Victoria and on this ground your

Memorialist is desirous of availing himself of the
Privileges granted to Aliens by the Act of Council
11th Victoria N^o 39.

That your Memorialist therefore respectfully
requests that Your Excellency may
be pleased to grant to your Memorialist
a Certificate under the provisions of
the said Act conferring upon your
Memorialist the privileges of a
Native Born British Subject with
such restrictions as to Your Excellency
may seem meet
