



Arrangements have been made for I.P.E.C. to collect and transport the ballot-paper to Western Australia.



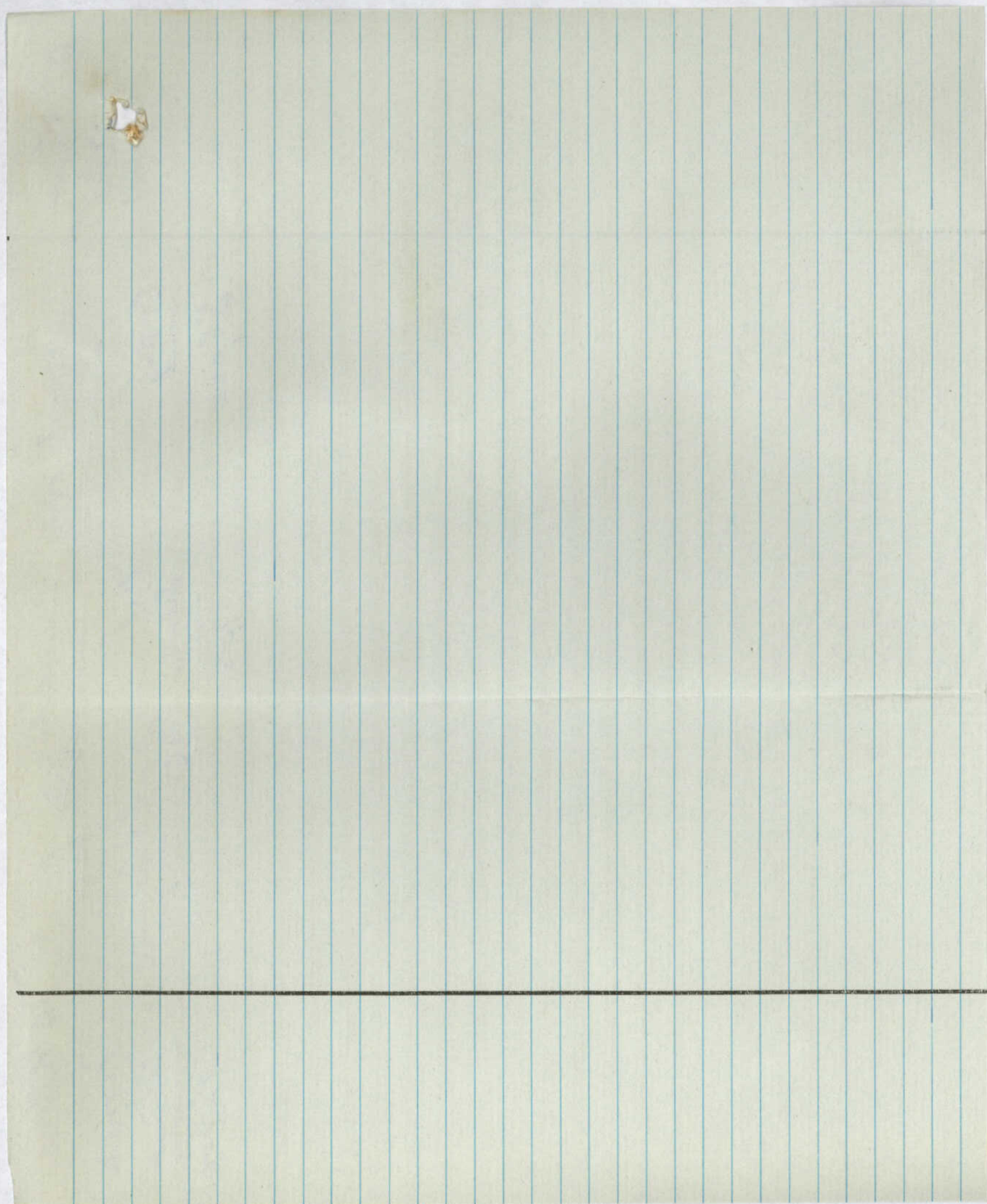

I acknowledge receipt of the specimens of the ballot papers to be used in connection with the Referendum, forwarded under cover of your memorandum abovementioned. I should like to mention, however, that on learning the size of the ballot paper I have taken action to double check the size of the sheets of pink water marked ballot paper held in store and have confirmed that they measured 27" x 34", thus a ballot paper of 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 11" would cut only 18 to a sheet of that paper.

Unfortunately this would mean that I would require approximately 78 reams for the purposes of the Referendum and this would leave me 7 reams short of requirements. I should be grateful therefore if arrangements could be made for say 7 reams to be transferred to me if held surplus in an adjoining or near adjoining State, or alternatively I seek your permission to utilize buff paper to the extent that is necessary to cover the whole of the absent ballot papers.

The above is regretted but I was anticipating that the ballot paper would cut 24 or more to a sheet when I anticipated that the 71 reams held would be sufficient.
