





With reference to your minute of the 13th January, 1947 forwarding copy of a letter addressed by Mrs.Frances Ryan to the Prime Minister, it would appear that the matter is one for consideration by the Department of External Territories and the Treasury, in regard to any readjustment of the pension which Mrs.Ryan is at present receiving.

It is suggested, however, that Mrs. Ryan could be advised to register any claim for compensation to which she may be entitled in respect of the death of her husband with the Controller of Enemy Property, Department of the Treasury, Canberra. The registration of the claim does not, of course, mean that any responsibility is accepted by the Commonwealth Government for its ultimate settlement. The question of whether any such claims will be accepted and regarded as valid will, of course, be dependent upon the terms of the Peace Treaties made with the Japanese Government in regard to such matters.

Dear Sir,

I have received word from Mr. E.J. Ward that he regrets that the back-dating of my pension to the time of my husbands death is not practicable. I have also heard from Mr. Sydney Smith, the Secretary of the Prisoners of War Relatives' Association, that you also regret that you cannot waive the death duties so unjustly imposed by the Government of the State of New South Wales on my husband's estate. I am deeply dismayed and most distressed to have this news.

I now write to you personally Sir, to let you know that I am not satisfied and beg you to treat the matter again fairly and justly.

I am the widow of Walter James Ryan whose life was sacrificed on the "Montevideo Maru" on 1st July, 1942. Your Government notified me of this in October, 1945, and in extending sympathy also said that "these men lost their lives defending their country just as surely as those who faced the enemy". May I say that they did face the enemy gallantly and fearlessly, as I have heard from a chaplain who did get out and I am a proud woman.

In answer to questions raised in the house by Mr. Anthony, M.P., Mr. Ward informed him that "dependants of civilians who lost their lives on the "Montevideo Maru" would receive pensions and benefits on the same lines as the service pensions. These pensions commence from the date of death and no duty has been charged on such estates. No inquiry into the tragedy of Rabaul has been allowed. You yourself have expressed the opinion that no good could come of it, but as a widow of one of the men I hope the inquiry will be made. Over 300 civilians were needlessly sacrificed and we women were kept in ignorance of our men's fate far too long. To us has been the years of anxiety, loneliness and sadness, and to many including myself, it has been years of hard work and separation from my children, having had one room to live in and go out to work. Money and inquiries cannot bring these men back to life, but if your Government stands for honesty and fair play, you will readily see that your debt is grevous and do all you can to make proper compensation to the widows and children who have been so desolated.

I therefore beg Sir, that you will reconsider my just claim for pension as from 1st July, 1942, instead of the approved date of 17th January, 1946, which has no bearing on my case whatsoever, also that I be reimbursed from the Federal Treasury for the £30 odd which has been so wantonly taken by the State Gevernment from my two children and myself. It is adding insult to injury.

Ever since Rabaul fell in 1942 I have worked and received no help from the Government instead, I have paid taxes, and it would appear that I have penalised myself in trying to aid rather than be a drag on your Government.

I have heard from the Repatriation Department that

they are going to assist me with my son who is just sixteen and leaves the Canberra Grammar School this term to take up apprenticeship. I now have to try and find somewhere for to live. My daughter who is only seven years old has so been deprived of a home and her parents, and for their takes I intend taking this matter up until I have a satisfactory result.

I trust therefore Sir, that you will do your utmost to revoke the unfair decisions made by your Government and give to me and my children our just dues.

Thanking you, and hoping to receive a favourable reply very soon.





In order to expedite consideration of her case, a copy of your letter and the enclosure thereto has been forwarded direct to the Secretary, Department of External Affairs, Canberra, with a request that you be informed of the decision.

I might mention that quite recently arrangements were made for the provision of compensation for dependants of officers and residents of New Guinea who lost their lives in the circumstances mentioned by you. Some time ago in "The West Australian" there appeared an article purporting to be a Government statement in which it was said that war pensions would be accorded to the widows and dependants of Australian civilians who perished on the "Montevideo Maru" the Japanese prison ship.

I have received a letter from the widow of one such victim - my sister-in-law, Mrs. Beryl Beazley, whose husband (my brother) perished on that ship. She has applied to the Social Services Department, showing them the cutting from the paper, and was informed that they knew nothing about it, and was persuaded to take the ordinary widow's pension, pro tem.

I shall be grateful if you will clarify the issue as to whether the newspaper was wrong, or whether a failure has occurred to notify the Western Australian Branch of your Department officially of this decision. Please forward your reply to Federal Members' Rooms, Perth.



With reference to a List supplied by your Department dated 11/1/45. behalf of one of our State Bureaux we recently made enquiries to SEAC Red Cross Singapore, in order to ascertain the correct date, and details of death of the abovenamed. Mr. Edwards was formerely an Accountant with Derrick and Company, Singapore, and was an Australian.

As a matter of interest, we give below an exact and entire copy of the reply recently received from SEAC Red Cross, Singapore.

> "In reply to your letter of April 16th., I have checked up the records concerning Pte. E.R. EDWARDS and find that he died in hospital in Thailand on 11th December 1943. On the S.S.V.F. records the cause of death is quoted as "emaciation, diarrhoea".

According to these records the grave number is "431, Cemetery 3", but we pass on this details for your information only as we are not sure if this cemetery is one of those which are completed. You may like to know that the War Graves Commission are proposing to send photographs of graves to the next of kin when the cemeteries are in order, but until they are completed and all the lists and numbers of graves are checked they prefer that we do not give the location of graves."

All of these transactions occurred in the Brisbane area, and there is a grave discrepancy, with respect to number, value and description, between the answer. given to my question and the Minister's subsequent statement, which were given within 24 hours of each other. original allegation was that some refrigerators had been sold for about £7 each to friends of the commission's officers. This information was checked when I was last in Brisbane and my informant, who unfortunately will not allow me to use his name unless he can secure a guarantee of protection, assured me that at least two of the refrigerators were sold by a lieutenant at Enoggera to friends — commissioned officers in base jobs-for £7 and £9 10s. respectively. These two refrigerators are now being repaired, the approximate costs of repair being £5 and £25 respectively.

I shall now quote some further allegations, which the Minister will be given an opportunity to disprove in accordance with a suggestion which I shall make. In late July or early August this year, there were at least twenty electric refrigerators at the Enoggera auction Some were complete, compound. and others had parts missing. should like to know what happened to each of them, what prices were paid for them, and who purchased them. It is also alleged that, about June this year, a number of kerosene-operated refrigerators were sold to a Brisbane foundry which is known to me for about £10 each, well below their actual value. Is this information correct, and were they all sold to the same firm? Have kerosene refrigerators been sold minus burners, which makes them practically useless, and have the burners been sold to the same purchasers a fortnight or so later? Does this practice bring refrigerators within the category of "wrecked machines" as interpreted the Minister's advisers? The truth of the regard to these refrigerators can be very easily determined. No machine can be taken from Enoggera without the production to the gate-Mr. Fadden.

keeper of an official receipt. The duplicates, or counterfoils, of such receipts obviously must be carefully preserved for audit purposes. Consequently, I make this very simple, yet effective, request to the Minister: That he obtain and lay on the table of this House for my inspection, before the parliamentary recess, the duplicates or counterfoils of official receipts for the sales of all refrigerators, whether kerosene or electric, in Queensland during the past six months. Will he also arrange a conference between me and the Auditor-General, giving me authority to suggest the lines of an investigation to be made by Mr. Abercrombie's officers with a view by ascertaining the truth or otherwise of the allegations made to me. If the Minister refuses these requests, it is a fair inference to draw that the Commonwealth Disposals Commission is unable to face the acid test which I have proposed.

The second item concerns the disposal of motor vehicles, including motor cycles, and motor tyres. With regard to motor tyres, the Minister stated in reply to my question—

Every tyre made available to the Commonwealth Disposals Commission is marketed as quickly as it is received, but, unfortunately the vast majority of releases at the moment, including the 13,000 referred to by Mr. Fadden, consist of non-commercial types of tyres, suitable only for use on war department designed vehicles.

I draw particular attention to the reference to "non-commercial types of cars, suitable only for use on war department designed vehicles". I need do nothing more than to quote Army Activities Bulletin No. 2, issued by the Minister for the Army on the 15th September, which states—

Items in excess of Army requirements due to obsolescence and the reduction in Army strength, and declared to the Commonwealth Disposals Commission between the 1st January, 1945, and the 25th August, 1945, included 35,231 tyres and tubes suitable for commercial vehicles and 17,383 motor vehicles.

Obviously, either the Minister for the Army and I are wrong, or the Minister for Defence has been misinformed. I leave it to the Ministers to resolve their differences. With regard to delays in the







Welligton St. Bondi in connection with matters arising out of the death of his son James Tynan. The lastnamed was employed as an assistant Steward on the Norwegian vessel "Herstein" and was captured by the Japanese at Rabaul. About a week ago our client received from the Minister a telegram which reads as follows:-

"It is with deep regret that I have to inform you that the translation of the nominal roll of the Japanese vessel Montevideo Maru which was lost with all hands after leaving Rabaul in 1942 shows that James Tynan was aboard the vessel and I desire to convey to you the profound sympathy of the Commonwealth Government".

The Norwegian Consul General has informed us that the name of James Tynan was not included in the list of members of the crew of the "Herstein", who perished with the Montevideo Maru. 

CIVILIANS REPORTED LOST ON SS "MONTEVIDEO MARU"

TORPEDOED OFF LUZON ON 1 JULY 1942.

l. Forwarded herewith is nominal roll of personnel reported to have been lost on SS "MONTEVIDEO MARU" as received from an AMP officer who is investigating Japanese Records in Tokyo. This roll represents a translation from the original roll in Japanese which was forwarded by the Japanese Ministry of Navy to the Tokyo Hurye Joho Kyoku (PWIB) on 6 January 1943 and comprises - Civilian Internees - Serial numbers 1 - 210, consisting 209 names.

Reference to the roll will indicate that in translating the proper names from KATAKANA into English it has been necessary in many instances to produce a rough phonetical rendering e.g. Serial 62 FARGARCUTSLAR. It is thought that the details against each name will enable identity to be established. It is likely that native place names have suffered considerable change in the process of being rendered into KATAKANA and back again into English.

It will be noted that many of the civilians appear to be of nationality other than British, although in some instances the details in the nationality column may have been intended as place of birth. The Scandanavians are, however, apparently all members of the crew of a Norwegian ship "Herstine".

4. The spelling of the civilians' names in most instances will probably require correction at your end. For information it is advised that a check has been made with Dept of External Territories List of New Guinea Residents reported Missing thought to have been captured by the Japanese and it may be that the surnames given hereunder refer to the persons indicated against the serial numbers appearing on the Tokyo Roll -

- (b) At a later date further lists will be forwarded advising additional names which can be eliminated and also with other matters raised in your letter DS 16/2/1 of 26 Sept 1945.

- 7. (a) It may be added that though the name of C. McKellar appears (No 204) on the Japanese Roll as being aboard the "MONTEVIDEO MARU", and is therefore assumed to have been drowned on 1 July 1942 when that ship was torpedoed, there is a possibility that he lost his life at an earlier date as the result of an attempted escape.
- (b) While the matter cannot be vouched for, there is some belief that in 1943 a Mr McDonald who had previously been District Officer at MANUS learned from natives that the body of Mr McKellar had been washed up on the beach after the embarkation on 22 June 1942 of the "MONTEVIDEO MARU".

8. Investigations are still continuing regarding other civilians in Rabaul at the time of the Japanese occupation, and further advices will be forwarded to you regarding the information obtained.


