Herewith brief report on assimilation activities for the month of April, 1953.


Residents entertained at Garden Party in Ipswich by the Ipswich Branch of the New Settlers League.

JANUARY.

At the conclusion of the year, the National Council of Women go into recess for three months and activities are more or less confined to the children who are home from school on holidays. The co-operation of the National Fitness Council was again welcomed and a full programme was enjoyed for three weeks. During these three weeks, Officers from the National Fitness Council, together with Centre helpers, entertained the children at sport, films, Punch & Judy shows and visits to the South Coast beaches. Some 150 children enjoyed day outings at the South Coast. Centre children also enjoyed a period away at holiday camps, a resume of which is the subject of a separate report.

FEBRUARY.

Again activities during this month were mainly confined to children at home on holidays.

MARCH.

During this month the Concert Party is being re-organized and plans for the coming year are well in hand.

On the 27th March, fifteen children and five adults in National Costume will help in a street collection for the Red Cross Society.

On Saturday the 28th March, 150 children will be entertained by the Royal Automobile Club of Queensland at their Annual Picnic.

Plans are in hand for the Coronation Day Celebrations and contact has been made with the Committee recently formed in Brisbane for this purpose.

Jun Walls 0838, 900-It was felt that films depicting the Royal Family and the significance of the Coronation would be welcomed by Migrants generally and enquiries have been made with local film companies as regards suitable films. To date, however, no such films are available and it is thought that films may be available at the Film Library at Canberra. Your advice as to the availability of suitable films would be appreciated.

During the month of May New Australians resident in this Centre have done quite a lot to bridge the gap between New and Old Australians as is indicated from the following resume of activities:-

Food for Britain Appeal

Approximately thirty women and children dressed in National costume gave their services to the "Food for Britain Appeal" in the capacity of Badge Sellers in the City of Brisbane on May 4th 1951; with the result that this fund was increased by over £60.

The Appeal Committee members personally expressed their appreciation of what they termed a particularly fine effort and later publicised the effort in a written appeal under the sponsorship of Sir Ian Fraser C.B.E., M.P. (copy attached).

Queensland Country Traders

A representative gathering of Queensland Country Traders (approx. 350 persons) were entertained by New Australians from this Centre on the occasion of their annual Dinner at Rowes Cafe in Brisbane on May 21st 1951. Guests at this dinner were from all parts of Queensland, therefore this gesture by New Australians would receive widespread publicity.

Army Concert

The First Field Squadron (R.A.E.), a permanent Army Unit stationed at Wacol next received attention. On this occasion members of the Centre Concert Party, by way of music, song and dance, entertained about 150 personnel. Major Marsden, in voicing the appreciation of the officers and men under his command, pointed out that apart from the excellent entertainment value of such a function, it had greater value in the fact that it revealed that New Australians were prepared to go to any length to become friends of Old Australians. A copy of the programme presented is forwarded herewith.

Empire Day Concert

The part played by New Australians at this concert was the subject of a separate memorandum.

Q.C.W.A. Concert

Perhaps the Concert Party's greatest triumph was on Wednesday night, May 30th, when they presented a variety programme in Albert Hall, Brisbane, to 400 delegates to the Annual Conference of the Queensland Country Women's Association. Almost every country centre was represented and it is almost certain that when the delegates report back to their own organisations they will have a kindly word for New Australians who provided a happy interlude in their deliberations at conference.

Queensland Blind, Deaf and Dumb Institute

A direct approach was made to the residents for contributions to the Queensland Blind, Deaf and Dumb Institute and ina all a sum of £31. 2. $5\frac{1}{2}$. was donated.

As a result of the publicity given to these activities, offers of assistance in the assimilation programme are being received from organisations not affiliated with the National Council of Women or the New Settlers League.
