

> Threats against Senator Neville BONNER and Aboriginal Establishments in Queensland.

I have to report that as instructed by Inspector E. GEORGE, I interviewed Senator Neville BONNER at 3.30pm, 2.9.71, at his chambers, Commonwealth Offices, Anzac Square, Adelaide Street, Brisbane.

- Senator BONNER stated that he had received certain information from Joyce WILDING, which he thought this Office should be aware of. Mrs. WILDING is matron of the Opal Joyce Wilding Memorial Home for Aboriginals at 2331 Pacific Highway, Eight Mile Plains, Brisbane, and comes in contact with all classes of people through her welfare work for the aboriginal people. She informed Senator BONNER that she had received the following information from a source she did not wish to disclose. Mrs. WILDING also wishes that her name be kept anonymous.
  - a. Radicals from the Aboriginal Tribal Council, universities and other radical elements intend to group together from various States and take over by force, if necessary, the aboriginal settlement on Palm Island. Mrs. WILDING was toldthat this group has enough arms to do so.
  - To take over the Department of Aboriginal and Island Affairs Office, 135 George Street, Brisbane.
  - To do bodily harm to Senator BONNER and even go as far as to exterminate him. If they cannot get to him they intend to take over the Opal Joyce WILDING Memorial Home in Brisbane, which action they believe will bring Mr. BONNER out in the open.
- Senator BONNER supports the authorities in their dealings with the aboriginal question and it is no doubt for this reason that the radical element is against him. Senator BONNER is himself an aboriginal.
- 4. The Queensland Police Special Branch have interviewed Senator BONNER and are submitting a report to their Commissioner. Apart from Senator BONNER's secretary, the chief attendant at the Commonwealth Offices, Chief Property Office, Department of the Interior, Special Branch and this Office no other person is aware of the information outlined in this report and Mr. BONNER requests this information be kept as confidential as possible.



Senator BONNER places little substance in the information he has received. However, he thought this Office and the State Police should be made aware of what he had heard. He believes there is no threat to the Commonwealth Offices or his staff, but has notified his Secretary and the chief attendant at the Commonwealth Offices, Anzac Square, Brisbane to notify Special Branch or this Office immediately on the arrival of any suspicious person or parcels at his Office.
