

I am grateful to the Australian authorities, too, for their handing over to me of the ashes for return to Japan. I shall be exceedingly obliged, therefore, if you will kindly convey to the Naval and other authorities concerned my sincere thanks for their thoughtful action, which will be deeply appreciated not only by the relatives of the deceased but also, I am sure, by the whole of my fellow countryment

SUBJECT NAMES OF JAPANESE WHOSE BODIES WERE RECOVERED FROM JAPANESE MIDGET SUBMARINES.

Be pleased to inform the Naval Board that the bodies of four Japanese were recovered from the two midget submarine raised from the bed of Sydney Harbour on the 5th and 6th of June, 1942.

From the uniforms and identification marks thereon, the names of the members of the crews are as follows :-

From the submarine raised in Taylor - Sub-Lieutenant KENJI NAKAUMA Bay on the 5th June, 1942. (No.21).

From the submarine raised in Taylor - TAKESHI OHMORI. Photograph Bay on the 5th June, 1942.

From the submarine raised off St. George's Head on the 6th June, 1942. (No.14).

- (Christian name unknown) - FUJIMORI. Photograph marked DB6/42.
- These Japanese were cremated at Eastern Suburbs Crematorium, Sydney, on the 9th June, 1942, vide message No.961 (Time of Origin 0159/11th June) addressed Naval Board from N.O.C.S..
- Neither the Press nor the Swiss Consul have been informed of the names of the Japanese whose bodies were recovered.
