WAR LEAVE PAYMENT—DECEASED SOLDIERS.

1. A War Leave Payment on the undermentioned scale and subject to the conditions stated below has been approved for payment to dependants of deceased members of the Australian Imperial Force and the Naval and Military Expeditionary Force who have served abroad. No amount of sustenance allowance is payable unless a member served abroad for a longer period than twelve months.

2. "Service abroad" extends from date of embarkation in Australia until date of death.

3. The scale is calculated on the following basis:—

**Pay.—**

- (a) 7½ days' pay of rank at time of death for each six months' service abroad.
- (b) Service for a period of less than six months but exceeding four months counts as six months.
- (c) An odd half day in the total amount of the payment period is considered a full day.

**Sustenance Allowance.—**

- (a) Sustenance Allowance at the rate of 3/- per day is payable for the period calculated under (a), (b), and (c) above, provided that the deceased member served abroad for a longer period than twelve months.

4. In the case of men who returned to Australia during their period of service or who re-enlisted, only the period of service abroad counts as service for the purpose of this payment.

5. Declarations, when completed and addressed, should be forwarded to the District Paymaster of the State in which the soldier enlisted.



Date of embarkation you will know; I have not got it in my records; the name of the ship was the Ceramic However and the Battalion the 15th. Date of death given in official certificate as June 9th. actually took place in May sometime before the 24 hour Armistice to bury the dead. My Mother was not sole beneficiary only receiving a lump sum legacy, the income from the estate each year afterwards being divided equally between myself, one other Brother, one Sister, and an Aunt. My Father died some months before war broke out.

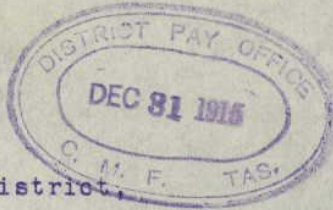

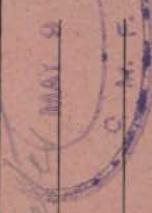
