





Dear Sir,

Further to my communication of the 12th September, 1924. I have to advise that it has been ascertained from Overseas Pay Records that for a short period prior to the death of your son, the late No.1459 Sergeant M. S. PCKENZIE, 1st Australian Clearing Hospital, he was paid at the rate of a Sergeant. No confirmation of this promotion can be found among the daily orders or field returns of his unit.

In view of the evidence obtained, however, the rank of Sergeant has been engraved on his British War and Victory Tedels. Under War Office Instructions the rank inscribed on the 1914/15 Star is that held by a soldier when the Star was earned, i.e., on first entering a theatre of war.

The British War and Victory Medals have this day been forwarded to you per separate registered post, bearing registered No. . G.P.O., Melbourne, and I shall be obliged if you will let me know whether they come safely to hand by signing and returning the enclosed receipt slip.

His final statement of account shows that his pay from 15-6-15 to 8-12-15 was 8/6d per dayand for the same period his deferred pay was 2/- per diem. This is a Sergeant's rate of pay. You were advised to the above effect in a communication from this office dated 14th February in reply to yours of 9th idem.




