



OPINION OF THE MEDICAL BOARD

Notes. - (i) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as, in the event of the man being invalidated, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.




Dear Sir,

With regard to the war medals of your younger son I have to advise you the British War Medal was transmitted to Headquarters, Victoria Barracks, Melbourne, on 2.12.21 for disposal in your favor, but in view of your statement action has since been taken to withdraw same and this together with the Victory Medal which now alone remains to be issued at this juncture will be forwarded to you under separate registered cover.

The name of every man who gave his life for Australia will be recorded in the Australian War Museum, which will be the Memorial of the Australian Nation to its honoured dead. The names will stand there for endless generations of our children to read them. These names will be recorded under the name of the town or district to which they belonged.

III.—PARTICULARS REQUIRED FOR INSCRIPTIONS ON WAR GRAVES.

The Imperial War Graves Commission will very shortly erect Headstones over the graves of members of the A.I.F. overseas. It is true that some graves have not yet been identified, but, whether you have received any particulars of a grave or not, you may say on the enclosed Form what Inscriptions you would like inscribed.

On the Headstone will be inscribed the "Rising Sun" badge, the regimental number and rank, name, military honours and decorations, unit, and date of death of the soldier.

A Cross will be placed on the Headstone, but, if you say on the Form that you do not desire the Cross to be inscribed, your wishes will be observed. If you require the Star of David instead of the Cross, please say so on the Form.

You will also be able to place a Personal Inscription on the Headstone. The idea of Personal Inscriptions is that they shall cover the expression of personal feeling and affection and be of the relatives' own choice. Please bear the following points in mind:—

- (i) Three lines are reserved at the foot of the Headstone for a Personal Inscription. The greatest number of letters which could be cut in the stone is 66, but this must be reduced by the number of spaces between the words. For instance, for an Inscription of twelve words, although the possible number of letters is 66, allowance must be made for 11 spaces between the words—leaving room for 55 letters only.
- (ii) The Personal Inscription will be inscribed at the expense of the applicant. The current rate per letter is stated by the Imperial War Graves Commission at 3½d., and this is subject to fluctuation. An account will be rendered to the applicant at a later date.
- (iii) The use of special alphabets such as Greek, &c., is not permissible.

The particulars you are asked to supply on the Form are also required for the Register of War Graves which the Commission proposes to establish in London.


