

Dear Sir,

I shall be much obliged if you will furnish me with the present address of Mrs. Catherine M.A. Clough, widow of the late No. 365 Corporal R.H. Clough, 5th Light Horse Regiment, as it is desired to dispose of War Medals etc., issuable on account of the service of the above-mentioned late soldier in accordance with the instructions given for the disposal of these items which prescribe that they must go to the next of kin in the following order of relationship:-

"Widow, eldest surviving son, eldest surviving daughter, father, mother..."

Corporal Clough enlisted as a single man recording you as next of kin; if there are good and sufficient reasons as to why War Medals etc., should not be handed to deceased's widow, I shall be glad to receive any statement you may care to make that would affect their disposal - your remarks should be embodied in the form of a Statutory Declaration and signed before a Justice of the Peace.
