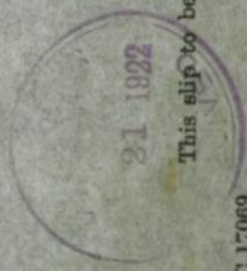

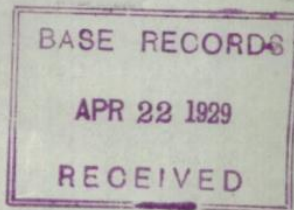

Dear Madam,

With further reference to the regrettable loss of your son, the late Lieutenant L.J. PRIMROSE, Australian Flying Corps, I am now in receipt of advice from the Imperial War Graves Commission confirming the report of this officer's burial in French Grave No. 53 of GATENOY FRENCH NATIONAL CEMETERY situated 6 miles East South-East of Clermont, France.

The Breuil-Le-Sec Military Cemetery, where your son was originally reported buried, is not now officially listed in connection with the overseas war graves and it is presumed that this Cemetery, among others, was found to be unsuited for permanent retention. In accordance with an agreement entered into with the French and Belgium Governments it is the practice of the Commission to remove all such burials to the nearest established military cemetery where their future maintenance and upkeep can be assured, and this action has evidently been taken in the case of your son's grave.

The delay in notifying you to this effect is regretted, but official confirmation has only recently been forthcoming as the result of an enquiry addressed to the overseas authorities following the receipt of the Commission's first intimation in the form of inscription fee account.
